AMENDMENT CHANGING DEBARY CITY COUNCIL TERMS OF OFFICE FROM 3 YEARS TO 4 YEARS.

A vote of "yes" would approve an amendment to DeBary's City Charter changing the terms of office for City Council Members from 3 years to 4 years commencing in 2015 for City Council Seats 3, 4, and 5, and in 2017 for City Council Seats 1 and 2, thereby causing the City's general elections to coincide with countywide elections held in even-numbered years with the expectation of increasing voter turnout and reducing election expenses.

CHARTER AMENDMENT 1

ELIMINATION OF 2 YEAR NON-STAGGERED TERMS FOR COMMISSIONERS

The City's Charter currently provides that each Commissioner's term of office is 2 years with all Commissioners up for election at the same time (non-staggered terms). The proposed charter amendment increases the term of office to 4 years and provides for staggered terms. If approved, the change to 4 year staggered terms would take effect immediately.

CHARTER AMENDMENT 2

ELIMINATION OF 2 YEAR TERM FOR THE MAYOR

The City's Charter currently provides that the Mayor's term of office is 2 years. The proposed charter amendment increases the Mayor's term of office to 4 years.

CHARTER AMENDMENT 3

ELIMINATION OF CONSECUTIVE TERM LIMIT FOR MAYOR

The City Charter currently limits only the office of Mayor to a 2 consecutive term limit. The proposed amendment would eliminate the term limit that currently exists only on the office of Mayor.

CHARTER AMENDMENT 4

ELIMINATION OF REQUIREMENT TO FILL VACANCY ON COMMISSION BY SPECIAL ELECTION

The City Charter currently requires the City to have a special election in the event a permanent vacancy occurs in any seat on the Commission when there is more than one year until the next regularly scheduled election. The proposed amendment would allow the Commission to appoint a temporary replacement to fill the vacated Commission seat until the next regularly scheduled election instead of calling a special election.

CHARTER AMENDMENT 6

SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

The City Charter currently allows the sale of alcoholic beverages between the hours of 7:00 AM until 2:00 AM. The proposed amendment would eliminate this provision thereby allowing the City Commission to determine when to allow the sale of alcoholic beverages.
